A. About Us: Overview

With a mission to become a Centre of Excellence for Higher Education where aspiring students can be transformed into skilled and well-rounded professionals, Career Institute of Technology & Management (CITM) affiliated to Maharshi Dayanand University, a State University of Haryana was established in the year 1997. It was conferred a status of Deemed University under Section 3 of UGC Act, 1956 by MHRD, GoI on the recommendations of the UGC, AICTE and Government of Haryana in the year 2008 in the name and style of Manav Rachna International University (MRIU). Vide MHRD Notification No. F.9-3/2007.U3(A) dt. 11/01/2018, the name of Manav Rachna International University, Faridabad (Haryana) has been changed to Manav Rachna International Institute of Research and Studies (Deemed to be University). Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India vide Notification No. F.9-3/2007/U3(A) Vol.2 dated 08-06-2018 has further extended/regularized the deemed to be University status to Manav Rachna International Institute of Research and Studies, Faridabad, Haryana from 21.12.2013 onwards. In pursuance to the Notification No. F-10/2016-U3 (A) dated May 13, 2019 issued by Ministry of Human Resources Development (MHRD), Department of Higher Education, ICR Division, Govt. of India, New Delhi, Manay Rachna Dental College (MRDC) has been included under the ambit of MRIIRS as a constituent Institution MRIIRS has registered an all-round growth in academics, research and development, ISR, student support and progression, leadership and governance, environmental consciousness besides achievements in many other exemplary processes and procedures.

3) Academics

5) Research

MRIIRS Research and Development Cell (RDC) is committed to research and innovation as a central part of its mission aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and the UGC's efforts to promote research that contributes meaningfully to the goal of a self-reliant India, known as Atma Nirbhar Bharat.

The main objective of RDC is to create a conducive environment for enhancement of research productivity, knowledge generation, facilitation of research, innovation and technology development and resource mobilization; thereby integrating Research, Innovation and



Technology Development for sound foundation for students and enhancing professional growth of faculty members.

A. Research and Development Cell

The RDC oversees the management of publications, innovations, and incubation activities at MRIIRS. Different research directors are appointed for each domain to achieve the yearly benchmarks set by the university. The university has engaged in numerous projects, both government and non-government, with a notable focus on initiatives such as the Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) and Atal Bhujal Yojna. Additionally, collaborations include projects with organizations like NSFM-ICAR, TARE Scheme SERB DST, Haryana State Council for Science, Innovation, and Technology, and the Indian Endodontic Society.

Another key component of this initiative is the Manav Rachna Incubation Centre designed to encourage and support the development of knowledge-based and technology-driven startups. The centre takes pride in its 107 alumni student startups and the presence of 85 startups on campus till the year 2023-24. Furthermore, the centre has gained the support of the Government of India-funded NexGen Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Centre (NexGen IEDC), aimed at helping students commercialize their innovative ideas. Additionally, the centre benefits from an active and vibrant Entrepreneurship Development Cell run by students. Each shortlisted student startup is provided with a prototype development grant of up to Rs. 2.5 lakhs. Over the past five years, there has been a significant achievement in research publications, with 2720 publications recorded in the Scopus database alone. MRIIRS has an established Research Policy which mention incentive scheme to encourage faculty members, resulting in a noticeable increase in publications in indexed and referred journals, reflecting the scientific prowess of researchers. This effort has led to an increase in the H-index from 17 in 2016 to 44 in Scopus and 35 in WoS (Web of Science) as of 2024.

These labs have state of art facilities sponsored by industry and organization named as Intel® Intelligent Systems Lab, The Applied Research Lab, Mitsubishi Authorized Training Centre, Sports Science Rehabilitation Centre, Centre of Dental Excellence.

Manav Rachna Centre For Advance Water Technology & Management (MRCAWTM) was established under FET, MRIIRS Faridabad on 13th April 2017 as a Centre of Excellence with the vision to ensure 'Clean water for all forever'. MRCAWTM is having five field research units, one



each at Barmer, Ballabhgarh, Khol-Rewari, Palwal and Panchkula. The center, has been recognized for its research acumen at State Government level, as reflected in award of State Government Projects on National Flagship Programs namely Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) and Atal Bhujal Yojna. In Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM), the university participated as State Implementation Support Agency (SISA) for Public Health Engineering Department (PHED) with funding of Rs 47.53 lacs for the year 2021-22 and has been given extension for one more year i.e., 2022-23. In Atal Bhujal Yojna Atal Jal, MRIIRS is associated as District Implementation Partner (DIP) with Water Resource and Irrigation for Atal Bhujal Yojna Atal Jal having Faridabad and Palwal Districts as work domains with funding of Rs 7.73 Crores for a period of 4 years.

MRCAWTM in its short period of journey of 5yrs, has been able to achieve significant milestones in the form of projects obtained, executed, and completed. So far 8 projects have been completed between June 2018 and June 2021 of worth ~Rs2.0 Cr.


